AIS offers demanding, individually reviewed and evaluated ethical development seminars for college undergraduates and graduate/professional students. Our aim is to help students consider the importance of trust, self-discipline, and mutual obligation to individuals and societies. Seminar content is drawn from provocative readings and questions, not the study and memorization of ethical precepts.

What The Seminars Offer





Gary Pavela, J.D.

Gary Pavela is a past President of the International Center for Academic Integrity. He was an administrator and teacher at the University of Maryland-College Park for over 25 years. During that time he developed Maryland's Code of Academic Integrity and was recognized as one of the University's "Outstanding Faculty Educators" by the Maryland Parents' Association. Pavela writes frequently on law and policy issues in higher education and has served on the Board of the Kenan Institute for Ethics at Duke University.



DeForest McDuff, Ph.D.

McDuff is a co-founder of the Academic Integrity Seminar and has tutored hundreds of students taking the Seminar.
